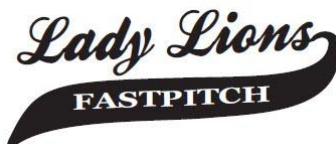

2010 Girls Fastpitch Softball Information

The LYBSA is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization that manages the Lyons girls fastpitch softball program. This is an organized team participation program for female youth from 5-19 years old. The emphasis of the program is on teamwork, sportsmanship, skill development and fun. During the season, teams meet two to three times per week for games and/or practices. A master game schedule will be available prior to the beginning of the season and is updated regularly. Practices will be scheduled separately by each team coach, based on local field and coach availability. A website with updates is forthcoming.

Please note the new Registration procedures

This year the LYBSA has decided to hold Registration days. On these days parents and players can come to the Town Hall and complete registration.

- What to bring with you
 - Copy of your player's birth certificate
 - Registration fees
 - Players sizes or your player
- What to expect
 - The purpose of registration day is two-fold. First, we are trying to set up a "one-stop shop" for parents. All at once you can ensure we have everything we need to properly register your player. It shouldn't take more than 30 minutes. We will collect all the necessary information and fees, answer any questions you have, and fit your player's uniform. Second, we would like to meet you and for you to meet us. We feel, as our organization grows, it is important for you to know who is responsible for your player's experience. This way you know whom to come to with questions or concerns. Also, we would like to know our parents better and to get them more involved.

Please join us at one of the registration dates and times. While we will be accepting registration forms through the mail and at town hall as we have before, we strongly encourage you to attend a registration day as to avoid late fees, miss-sizing and missing documents.

Registration Deadline:	March 22nd (note: after March 22nd , add \$15 fee for late registration)
Registration Cutoff:**	March 29th
Practices begin:	April 1st
Regular Season games start:	May 1st
Tune-up Tournament	April 23-25
End of Season Tournament	July 10-11

** Players registering after the *Registration Cutoff* date will be accepted on a space available basis only. After this date, league scheduling is complete and it is no longer possible for us to add new teams. Players will still be accepted onto any team that is not closed throughout the regular season provided they meet other eligibility requirements.

Player Code of Conduct

All players/participants who register to participate in any sport or activity offered by the LYBSA must abide by this player code of conduct. Participation in activities offered by the LYBSA, including such things as team practices and games, clinics, tournaments and other events, is a privilege, not a right. Player participants may be disciplined, suspended or expelled from LYBSA activities for any violation of these rules.

Disciplinary action, up to and including suspension or dismissal of a player from the team for up to the remainder of the season is at the discretion of the head coach. Appeal may be made to the LYBSA board of directors whose decision will be final. We encourage coaches and parents to work together to work things out before any situation becomes critical.

Player Code of Conduct

1. Participants will always conduct themselves so as to maintain the highest principles, integrity, and dignity for their team.
2. Participants will always adhere to the spirit and letter of the playing rules established by the LYBSA, Indian Peaks Girls Softball Association (IPGSA), United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA) or other governing body as applicable.
3. Participants must accept the authority of all game officials. At no time is it appropriate to demonstrably question the decisions and actions of game officials.
4. Participant actions will never deliberately jeopardize the safety and well being of opponents, teammates, officials, or spectators.
5. Participants will honestly report all injuries and medical conditions to a coach in a timely manner.
6. Participants must never physically abuse another player, coach or official. Such abuse is cause for immediate expulsion from all LYBSA activities.
7. Participants engaged in substance abuse and/or possession of drugs, alcohol, tobacco or any controlled substance will be immediately expelled from all LYBSA activities.
8. Participants engaged in destruction of property, theft or violation of local, state or federal laws will be immediately expelled from all LYBSA activities.
9. Participants will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.

In the event a player is asked to leave a team, LYBSA registration, clinic, tournament, uniform and other fees will not be refunded.

Sport Parent Code of Conduct

The LYBSA has adopted the National Youth Sports Safety Foundation's Sport Parent Code of Conduct. All parents and/or guardians, family and guests of LYBSA players are required to abide by this code of conduct.

Preamble

The essential elements of character building and ethics in sports are embodied in the concept of sportsmanship and six core principles: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and good citizenship. The highest potential of sports is achieved when competition reflects these "six pillars of character."

I therefore agree:

1. I will not force my child to participate in sports.
2. I will remember that children participate to have fun and that the game is for youth, not adults.
3. I will inform the coach of any physical disability or ailment that may affect the safety of my child or the safety of others.
4. I will learn the rules of the game and the policies of the league.
5. I (and my guests) will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and spectators at every game, practice or other sporting event.
6. I (and my guests) will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.
7. I will not encourage any behaviors or practices that would endanger the health and well being of the athletes.
8. I will teach my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
9. I will demand that my child treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect regardless of race, creed, color, sex or ability.
10. I will teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game or his/her performance.
11. I will praise my child for competing fairly and trying hard, and make my child feel like a winner every time.
12. I (and my guests) will never ridicule or yell at my child or other participant for making a mistake or losing a competition.
13. I will emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit my child over winning. I will also de-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.
14. I will promote the emotional and physical well being of the athletes ahead of any personal desire I may have for my child to win.
15. I (and my guests) will respect the officials and their authority during games and will never question, discuss, or confront coaches at the game field, and will take time to speak with coaches at an agreed upon time and place.
16. I (and my guests) will demand a sports environment for my child that is free from drugs, tobacco, and alcohol and I will refrain from their use at all sports events.
17. I (and my guests) will refrain from coaching my child or other players during games and practices, unless I am one of the official coaches of the team.

I understand that violation of this code may result in disciplinary action as described in the *LYBSA Policy & Procedure for Disciplinary Action* document, available upon request. Disciplinary action may include but is not limited to the following:

- Verbal warning by official, head coach and/or LYBSA official.
- Written reprimand placed on file with the LYBSA by an official, head coach and/or LYBSA official.
- Probation as determined by the LYBSA Board of Directors.
- Single or multiple game / practice suspension as determined by the LYBSA Board of Directors.
- Expulsion of player participant by the LYBSA Board of Directors.

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
